JANUARY/FEBRUARY 2022

Cover: Broadway legend André De Shields on life, career, Covid-19 and HIV. Inside: The 2022 POZ HIV/AIDS Awareness Day poster; the ANCHOR study proves that early treatment of abnormal anal cell changes can reduce anal cancer risk . Plus: How well do COVID vaccines work for people with HIV?

MARCH 2022

Cover: Longtime AIDS activist Peter Staley shares an excerpt from his memoir, *Never Silent: ACT UP and My Life in Activism*. Inside: The winners of the 2021 POZ Awards; members of ACT UP Los Angeles launch an oral history project. Plus: Apretude, the first long-acting injectable for PrEP.

APRIL/MAY 2022

JUNE 2022

Plus: Crystal methamphetamine continues to ensnare gay men, distorting their sex lives and increasing their HIV risk.

JULY/AUGUST 2022

Cover: Tom Perrault recounts his journey toward hopefully controlling HIV without medication. Inside: People living with HIV are meeting the accelerating challenges of the opioid epidemic; the basics of clinical trials. Plus: The 2022 HIV Drug Chart.

SEPTEMBER 2022

Cover: Yolanda Santana lives with HIV and limited mobility. Aging and other conditions often pose additional challenges for those with HIV. Inside: The AIDS Memorial Quilt turns 35; the basics of monkeypox. Plus: Film director, producer and screenwriter Lee Daniels confronts his demons by caring for his communities

OCTOBER/NOVEMBER 2022
